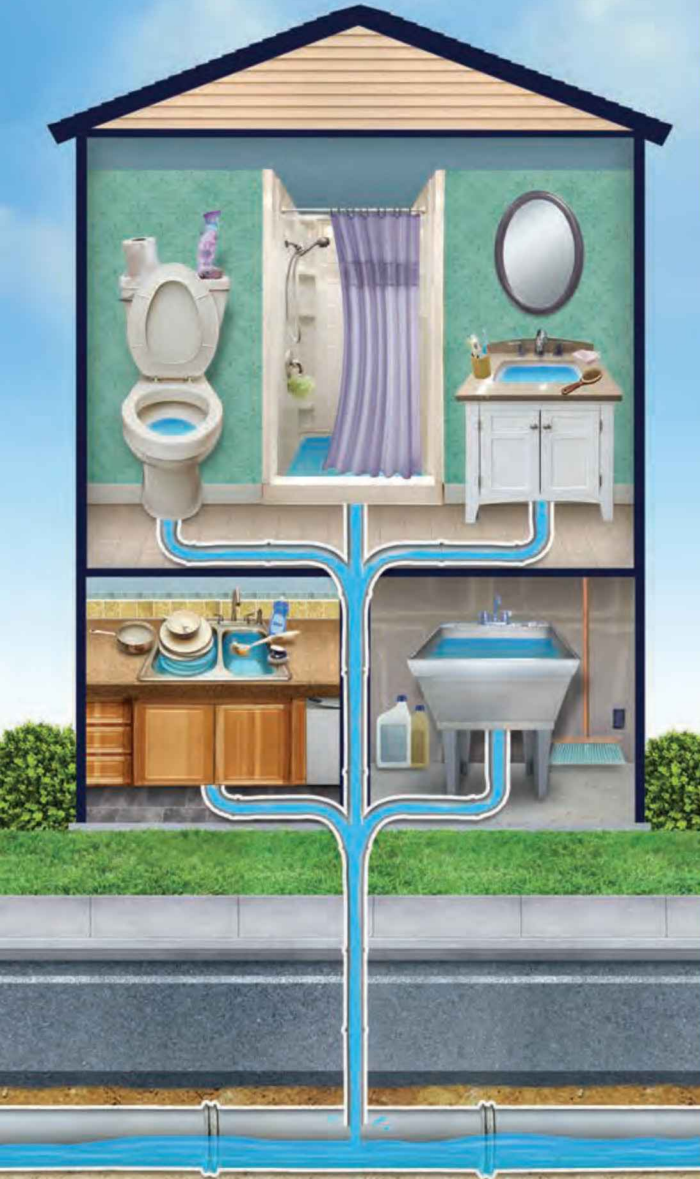


All drains in your home flow into the same sewer pipe!



Clogged pipes can cause expensive and messy sewer back-ups and overflows in your home and in our city. If you notice a serious problem in or near your home, call Granger-Hunter Improvement District at (801)-968-3551.

Fats, oils, and grease (F.O.G.) from food waste, scraps and cooking when poured down the drain, clog pipes and cause sewer backups and overflows.

THESE SIMPLE TIPS CAN HELP YOU STAY CLOG-FREE:

- NEVER pour grease or cooking oil down drains or garbage disposals.
- For small amounts of FOG, scrape out or use paper towels to wipe your pans, and place the FOG or soiled paper towels into the garbage.
- For large amounts of FOG, such as used oil from a turkey fryer, collect cooled oil in a seal-able container and dispose of properly.
- Use food strainers in kitchen sinks to catch food particles and place them into the garbage or compost.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Never dump paint, paint thinner, cleaning chemicals, pesticides, fertilizer, root killer or any product that has a CAUTION-WARNING-DANGER-POISON label down a sink or toilet.

Did you know?

Cleaning wipes, baby wipes, and facial wipes can be one of the biggest problems for sewer back-ups. That's right, even if the package says "FLUSHABLE" or "DISPOSABLE", they should NEVER be flushed. These items belong in the garbage.

Flush **ONLY** toilet paper. Put trash in the trash can.
